



DOMAINE BOISSON

Region: Southern Rhône (Vaucluse) Village: Cairanne

Property:

The Domaine dates back to the mid-19th century, when great-great grandfather of Régis, bought the land including a small stone cottage. Originated as a poly-culture farm. After WWII René Boisson, father of Régis developed the estate. After the olive trees froze in the winter of 1956, he decided to replace them with the vines. The current generation is Bruno Boisson, taking over outright for Régis in 2010.

It was in 1956 that René established his own production and left the Cave Cooperative of Cairanne. Boisson's first domaine bottling was in 1986. Vinification in the cellar is supervised by Philippe Cambie.

CÔTES DU RHÔNE VILLAGES MASSIF D'UCHAUX 'CLOS DE LA BRUSSIÈRE'

60% Grenache, 40% Mourvèdre

60-65 year old vines are planted on silex(flint) soils

The Mourvèdre is aged in demi-muids and the grenache in concrete tanks for 9 months before bottling.

Bruno's grandfather René Boisson purchased the 2 hectare plot in 1957, situated in the Lagarde-Paréol district of Massif d'Uchaux. René even rebuilt the stone fence to reestablish the Clos, one stone at a time. Their next door neighbor Fonsalette lies just the north of Clos de la Brussière.
